# The One Who Can Save or Destroy

Nor do the Law and the Gospel differ in the sense that they contradict each other. There are no contradictions in the Bible. Only paradoxes, which are only apparent or seeming contradictions. James 1:12-18; 2:5-12.

God does not change, nor does He contradict Himself. Instead God consistently threatens the person with the Law who believes that he or she is inherently good, thinks he or she can keep the Law, and thereby gain heaven. And God consistently comforts with the Gospel of Christ's free forgiveness the broken, humbled, and frightened sinner who has come to realize that he or she does not
